Travel Suggestions

By public transportation

Campus WU is located between the two U2 subway stations Messe-Prater and Krieau.

The AD building, Meetingroom 1 lies in the west of the Campus. Please use the U2 subway station Messe-Prater, exit Messe. (5 minutes walking to WU).

Bus line 82A (stop Südportalstrasse) and streetcar line 1 (stop Prater Hauptallee) also stop close to Campus WU.

By plane

Get on the S-train (S7) from "Airport Vienna" (direction Floridsdorf) to "Praterstern". Change here and take the subway "U2" (direction Seestadt) to "Messe-Prater" (one stop only).

By train

Hauptbahnhof: take the U1 direction Leopoldau to Praterstern – U2 direction Seestadt to Messe-Prater

Westbahnhof: take the U3 direction Simmering to Volkstheater – U2 direction Seestadt to Messe-Prater

Bahnhof Praterstern: take the U2 direction Seestadt to Messe-Prater

By car

The underground parking garage is located under the main boulevard running through the campus. The entrance to the garage is on Trabrennstrasse. The garage has 411 parking spaces; 180 spaces are for short-term parking, the rest is reserved for long-term pass holders. There are four exits to the campus from the garage. All exits lead to the outside, so that visitors can enter all campus buildings from their main entrances on the ground floor.
